Grade: 1-5

Summary: A valuable environmental lesson to children and adults. Discusses the importance of taking care of our Earth and its resources. As the story unfolds, they will learn about the effects of greed and destruction a group of people can have on the environment. In the end, the viewers are taught the lesson of what can happen to our Earth and its resources if we do not take care of them.
